He has been a stockbrokerage professional since 1994. He began writing on March 11<sup>th</sup>, 2007, the three year anniversary of the Madrid bombings and the midpoint of 9/11. Every year the LA CFRW clubs register voters at the Los Angeles County Fair grounds which are located at 1011 W. McKinley Ave., Pomona. The fair runs from Friday, September 4, 2015 through Sunday, September 27, 2015. Our WHRWF date to work is September 26th 10 AM to 3 PM. Check your calendars. Local state government officials are registering non-U.S. citizens as valid voters — even when the non-citizens say they are not Americans on their voter registration forms, a former Justice Department attorney tells The Daily Caller. J. Christian Adams, a former United States Department of Justice official in the Civil Rights Division will show the Supreme Court in a brief later this month that non-citizens are registering to vote through the government’s motor voter program. The motor voter act became law during the Clinton administration as an easier way to register voters through their local Department of Motor Vehicles offices,

but Adams says the program is failing to weed out those who are not American citizens.

“The bigger problem is that when they get those drivers licenses, there’s a government social services agency that is compelled under motor voter to offer voter registration,” Adams says. “For example, I’m representing a client — the American Civil Rights Union. We’re about to file a brief to the Supreme Court that shows actual voter registrations of people who on their voter registration forms that they’re not citizens, but they’re still getting registered to vote.”

Adams says they are going to file documents showing the names and addresses of non-citizens who were registered to vote, despite marking on forms they were not Americans, in their brief. Adams notified the Justice Department’s voting section and public integrity offices of the issue in letters sent to both DOJ divisions, but he says they have not acted on the information. The DC sent an inquiry to the DOJ, but did not receive a response. Source: [The Daily Caller](#) -

California Advisory Committee to the  
Project Proposal: Voting Rights in California

### Status Report

The *Voting Rights in California* proposal is surging! We will have a hearing toward the end of July. Presenters/witnesses invited for questioning and examination are representatives from relative government agencies and private organizations: the California Secretary of State, U.S. Department of Justice, PEW Charitable Fund, Election Integrity Project, Los Angeles County and San Diego County Registrars of Voters, and, potentially, other witnesses to voting irregularities and violations against the Help America Vote Act (HAVA), in California. We are collecting documents and building up our methodologies. My excitement builds with each letter sent.

What if, just what if, we really could make a difference?

Notice of the hearing will be given in compliance with CA the Brown Act, and we will notify those who have turned in official incident reports to EIP of the date, place and time.

# Legislation

Jerry Brown continues issuing ridiculous conservation targets and is now taking it a step further. His proposal to grant new enforcement powers to local agencies would include penalties of up to \$10,000 for the worst offenders. Initially, these fines did not exceed \$500 per day. Brown also plans to propose legislation to speed environmental permitting for local water supply projects, but not for the things California actually needs, which is water storage!

Similarly, Brown announced incredibly ambitious goals for reductions in greenhouse gas emissions. Indeed, California's regulatory framework is set to become the strictest in the entire country. Specifically, Brown has called for an 80% reduction of emissions below 1990 levels by 2050.

Brown has also revised his plan for the twin water tunnels that aimed at diverting water around the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta to several state and federal diversion canals near Tracy. The project is necessary to stabilize water deliveries throughout the state and help restore the Delta ecosystem. The revised plan would call for thousands of acres of ecosystem restoration and protection to compensate for construction and operation of the tunnels project. That is, Brown chooses to focus on environmental projects over the more demanding, crucial task of finding ways to store our water.

Discouragingly, several bills related to this issue have died. AB 311 (Gallagher, R) would have streamlined environmental reviews of water storage projects, but was opposed by environmentalists and Democrats. Similarly, Andy Vidak's bill was also

struck down. Ironically, the day after AB 311 was killed, Brown issued his proposal to increase penalties for water usage and expressed his desire to expedite these types of environmental projects within Prop 1.

Ultimately, it is necessary to understand and confront the fact that we cannot conserve our way out of this drought! We have to prepare for the future through the construction of new water storage projects, because so much water is being wasted every single day! Brown's move to expedite environmental projects instead of focusing on what we truly need to support 30 million people is simply irresponsible.

**AB 889** (Chang, R): This bill would grant high school students in newly popular STEM — science, technology, engineering and math — programs to take community college classes using secondary funding if their schools don't offer the courses. It aims to increase educational opportunities for high school students, allowing them to concurrently enroll in STEM courses that will ultimately set them up for success in the future. **CFRW SUPPORTS THIS BILL!** This bill is set to be heard in the Assembly Committee on Appropriations. Please call your representatives and ask them to vote **IN SUPPORT** of this bill!

## Thomas Paine Scholarship

We had a very successful 2015 Scholarship program. Eight applications were received, at least one from each school, (Taft, El Camino, Louisville and Calabasas) and each entry was worthy of consideration. After hours of review, study and deliberation, our judges selected Mara Goldman from Calabasas as the \$2,000 winner and Joanna Hamermesh from Louisville as the \$1,000 winner. Both girls read their essays at our May meeting and were well received. There is still hope for our country with young Americans like these preparing for the future!

We also made significant strides in consolidating relationships with the counselors at each school. They know we are serious about our scholarships and that we plan to continue this program for the foreseeable future. This is important for them to know. Also, experience is a good teacher and we learned a lot about how to get the information about the scholarship out to the local residents as well. So with the counselors aware of our long-term commitment, notices out to Naviance and other scholarship groups, and with press coverage and notices placed

in local businesses, we feel next year will produce more awareness and, thus, more applicants.

As I stated at the meeting, if any of you would like to become a judge for the scholarship applications, please let me know. It is, however, a very difficult and time consuming responsibility. So be prepared and remember the judging comes right around tax time if that may be an issue for you. Also, if you have an essay question you would like to submit, please do so. The question should place emphasis on knowledge of the Constitution, the Bill of Rights, American exceptionalism or meaningful American history. We want the students to have to give a lot of thought (and maybe even a little learning) to answering the essay question. And remember it is 50% of the score.

Mara Goldman Essay-Winner of the 2015 Thomas Paine Merit Scholarship

Wikipedia defines American exceptionalism as “the theory that the United States is qualitatively different from other nations” due to its belief in liberty and personal freedom. This is a big idea, one that transcends not only politics but also the everyday lives of every single citizen. It means something completely different to each person, whether he or she be the president, a retiree on Social Security, or a soldier in the armed forces. Yet, what does American exceptionalism mean to me, a 17 year old girl, born and raised having lived only in this country my entire life?

In fact, I have been imbued with the idea of American exceptionalism ever since I can remember. My parents came to this country in the late 1980s, immigrants from the Soviet Union. Their families were oppressed for their Jewish religion and confronted with barriers to success. Because of their ethnicity my parents were required to work twice as hard as any other applicants to be accepted to university. My grandparents experienced anti-Semitism at work, stifling their professional growth and creativity. Unsatisfied with the status quo, they decided to take control of their lives and to move to the United States, even though that meant starting over in a new country without a penny to their names.

Finally presented with the freedom of self-expression and a right to the pursuit of happiness, my family was not only able to survive, but also to prosper. My mother attended university and was finally able to become a doctor that owned her own practice, an idea unheard of in the Soviet Union. She was hindered by neither her gender nor her Jewish beliefs. My grandparents pursued their passions for science, finally able to take credit for their own research in the form of patents. By rewarding hard work and determination, the United States allowed them to grow and to thrive, creating a life they had previously only imagined. This appreciation and love my family felt for this country was instilled in me as soon as I learned to speak English. I was taught the importance of the Pledge of Allegiance so that I could enthusiastically recite it every morning in Kindergarten. I was surrounded by pride in the United States and taught the respect that our flag garnered. My family would repeat over and over again how we lived in the most amazing place in the world, and from a very young age I took that fact to heart. I felt as though I could do anything and be anyone that I could imagine. American Exceptionalism is not superiority or ethnocentrism. Nor is it merely the idea that the United States is different from any other nation. Instead, American exceptionalism is the belief that every person in America has the ability to accomplish whatever they desire and to seize every advantage granted to them in this land of opportunity.



Joanna Hamermesh Essay-Winner of the 2015 Thomas Paine Merit Scholarship

America has time and time again proved to be the greatest country on Earth. Our great nation holds itself to a higher standard and is an example to other countries. We have achieved our place because of our quest to provide and preserve freedom for our citizens and to help extend those freedoms to others throughout the globe. 

**BEN CARSON** "it's time for the people to rise up and take the government back." (Wall Street Journal) By Matthew Dolan and Reid J. Epstein

DETROIT—seeking to overcome odds that favor candidates with deeper political experience, retired neurosurgeon Benjamin S. Carson returned to his hometown in Detroit on Monday to declare his bid for the Republican presidential nomination.

"I'm Ben Carson and I'm a candidate for president of the U.S.," said Mr. Carson, speaking before several hundred people in the city's downtown Music Hall Center for the Performing Arts.

At the event, the retired doctor featured his upbringing by his impoverished but hardworking single mother and highlighted his own work ethic that propelled him to chief of pediatric neurosurgery at Johns Hopkins University.

His main political arguments as a presidential candidate center on a belief that the nation's economic recovery has been overestimated by current officeholders, leaving many Americans anxious about their county's future. He is pushing for lower corporate taxes, for example, as a way to encourage companies to move their assets back to the U.S. and reinvigorate the economy.

Born into poverty in Detroit in 1951, Mr. Carson graduated from Yale University and the University of Michigan's medical school, then moved to Baltimore. At age 33, he became the youngest head of pediatric neurosurgery at Johns Hopkins and the first African-American to hold

the post.

When he was 37, Mr. Carson became the first doctor to successfully separate twins conjoined at the head. In 2008, President George W. Bush awarded him the nation's highest civilian honor, the Presidential Medal of Freedom.

His first book, *Gifted Hands: The Ben Carson Story*, became a staple in inner-city schools and church book clubs.

Another book, *One Nation*, is Mr. Carson's political manifesto, calling, among other things, for term limits for federal judges and a new constitutional convention.

Mr. Carson made an explicit call to people to quit longtime associations with political parties—he didn't explicitly say African-Americans—and become political free agents. If they did so, he implied, they would support his candidacy.

"Stop being loyal to a party or to a man and use your brain to think for yourself," he said in a city where Republicans hold little ground and in a state won twice by Mr. Obama.

On Monday, Mr. Carson said he understood "I don't have a lot of experience busting budgets," Mr. Carson said. "But I do have a lot of experience solving problems."

**Mike Huckabee** served as governor of Arkansas from 1996 to 2007. He previously hosted a Fox News talk show and is the author of 12 books. He campaigned for the Republican nomination in 2008 and placed second in total delegates won, behind eventual nominee Sen. John McCain. Mr. Huckabee that year won the first-in-the-nation Iowa caucuses. An ordained Southern Baptist minister, he is best known as a social conservative who opposes abortion and same-sex marriage. He lives in Florida. Huckabee vowed to end "stagnant wages," protect Medicare and defeat radical Islamic terrorism.

The 59-year-old Huckabee has a strong following among the party's evangelical Christian base but this time will face stiff competition for that vote from such primary candidates as Dr. Ben Carson and Sen. Ted Cruz, of Texas.

He vowed to protect Medicare and give states more of a say in government and education.

"Huckabee advocates a national consumption tax, which is similar to a sales tax, to replace the existing federal taxes on personal income and payrolls. He rejects calls for a minimum wage hike, saying his proposals will yield a "maximum wage" for workers. On immigration, he insists on a secure border and bemoans the presence of millions of people who are living in the country illegally, though he favors a creating a path to citizenship for children of immigrant parents who brought them to the U.S. illegally.

But whatever the issue, Huckabee, also an author, wraps his appeal as a pitch to everyday Americans who he says "don't feel like anybody understands or knows who they are, much less cares what's happening to them."

She currently serves as the Chairman of the American Conservative Union Foundation, which annually hosts CPAC (the largest

annual gathering of conservatives); the Chairman of Good360, the world's largest product philanthropy organization; and the Chairman of Opportunity International, the largest non-profit micro-finance lender in the world giving out \$6 billion at an average of \$150 per loan lifting millions out of poverty around the world. In 2014, Carly launched the Unlocking Potential Project, a new PAC aimed at engaging women voters and refuting the false notion that conservative ideas and principles amount to a "war on women." The UP Project's grassroots efforts aided Republican wins in crucial elections across the country, from Iowa to Colorado.


