### Lorraine Mabbitt

Republican Herbert Hoover was elected in 1928, to become the 31<sup>st</sup> President, and served one term. He was an engineer, administrator, and humanitarian.

His wife, Lou Henry Hoover, was the first President's wife to make a speech broadcasted on the radio in 1929.

Eight years prior to becoming the First Lady, Mrs. Hoover said, 'That we have the vote means nothing. That we use it in the right way means everything. Our political work has only begun when we have the ballot. And that work should be carried out exactly as our college work is — as any good work which we undertake is — it must be thoughtful, idealistic, clean, effective."

After the loss of the 1933 election, during which Lou was repeatedly shocked by the cruelty of people around the country towards her and her husband, she became very disenchanted with politics and withdrew from the spotlight. She did continue to work with the Girl Scouts, especially during WWII to raise funds for the army

The most significant barrier facing the women's ability to deal with the present emergency of the "Great Depression" was misplaced pride. Hoover observed: "The last person in town to ask for help will be the self-respecting man or woman, unemployed for the first time in his or her life.' It was incumbent on women assisting in this emergency to tactfully approach their neighbors and provide the requisite aid.

Lou Henry Hoover quietly donated \$300 to help the unemployed and their families in Palo Alto in January 1933. According to online inflation calculators, 300 dollars in 1933 would have more than \$5000 purchasing power in 2017. Mrs. Hoover asked that this charitable enterprise not be publicly acknowledged.

Mr. Hoover learned the full lavishness of his wife's charities only after her death on January 7, 1944; she had helped the education, he said, "of a multitude of boys and girls." In retrospect he stated her ideal for the position she had held: "a symbol of everything wholesome in American life."

Let us continue to emulate Mrs. Hoover in our efforts to "have the ballot" and support thoughtful, clean, idealistic, and effective political work.

## **President Trump is a real life James Bond**

President Trump single-handedly has successfully completed the greatest human intelligence coup in the history of intelligence spy-craft. And all on Twitter.

While the empty echo-chamber of Washington DC rattles and prattles on about President Trump's "fitness" to be President of the United States, President Trump single-handedly successfully completed the greatest human intelligence coup in the history of intelligence spy-craft. This is what the New York Timesstated, "At the start of Donald Trump's presidency, American intelligence agencies told the new administration that while North Korea had built the bomb, there was still ample time — upward of four years — to slow or stop its development of a missile capable of hitting an American city with a nuclear warhead."

The North's young leader, Kim Jong-un, faced a range of troubles, they assured the new administration, giving Mr. Trump time to explore negotiations or pursue countermeasures. One official who participated in the early policy reviews said estimates suggested Mr. Kim would be unable to strike the continental United States until 2020, perhaps even 2022. Mr. Kim tested eight intermediate-range missiles in 2016, but seven blew up on the pad or shattered in flight — which some officials attributed partly to an American sabotage program accelerated by President Barack Obama.

And while the North had carried out five underground atomic tests, the intelligence community estimated that it remained years away from developing a more powerful type of weapon known as a hydrogen bomb."

There you have it. At the start of President Trump presidency in January 2017, and after 8 years of then-President Obama, the vaunted US intelligence assessment was 100% wrong on perhaps the most urgent military/national security issue ever facing the United States. This US intel assessment was even more catastrophically wrong because if the US Intel community was 100% wrong on North Korea, then the same intel community was 10000% wrong on the state of Iran's nuclear and missile capabilities (excuse the hyperbole).

Everyone knows that Iran financed North Korea's nuclear and missile program with part of the \$150 Billion dollars Obama gave to Iran. So, not only did Obama's intelligence corps spectacularly fail on its assessment, Obama gave Iran and North Korea the funds to finance the final push to their nuke and missile arsenals.

Which brings us to the post-January 2017 President Trump Tweet-trap intelligence operation. President Trump, like any spy-master, looks for his asset's greatest weakness. In this case, President Trump concluded Kim Jong-Un's greatest weakness was his personal vanity. Once President Trump saw Kim's "vanity-weakness," he exploited it by tweeting personally nasty comments against the North Korean lunatic. US intelligence spent tens of billions of dollars and pays hundreds of "experts" to study North Korea's nuclear and missile capability, and they got it catastrophically wrong. Meanwhile, President Trump with nothing but his New York real estate smarts and his tweeter feed delivered the real intelligence of state of North Korea's nuclear arsenal.

As an aside, what was President Trump supposed to tweet-back to Kim Jong-Un's "nuclear button on the table" remark? Anything President Trump tweeted would have been derided by the Trump-haters. Trump is in a no-win hate-Trump-at-all-costs situation. Had he not tweeted back at all, the Left would have railed that President Trump was bested by his own tweeting game, and showed fatal weakness.

### 7 Things Conservatives can learn from President Trump's First Year in Office

Donald Trump's election felt like a revolutionary act and love him or hate him, his first year in office has rewritten the rules of the political game. That's why it's surprising how little political thinking seems to have shifted. There are some big lessons we can learn from Trump's first year in office.

- 1) Conservatives Have Lost Faith That Good Behavior Will Be Rewarded: There was a time when conservatives took great pride in being the sort of people who wouldn't tolerate a Ted Kennedy, Marion Barry or William Jefferson in their ranks. However, eventually conservatives have started asking a basic question: How does this benefit us? Do we get credit from the American people for being more moral than liberals? Is this helping us to succeed? What's the pragmatic value of doing the right thing beyond feeling superior to the Left? When conservatives concluded there was no practical value to having high standards, standards declined. A lot. In a hurry. Is that a good thing? No, but when you create a situation where virtue is no longer rewarded, you can't expect virtuous people to slam their heads into a wall forever.
- 2) Conservatives Have Lost Faith In The Old Guard Institutions And Personalities: The attitude seems to be, "What good did all these talk radio hosts, conservative websites and columnists do? Did the country move to the Right under Bush? Did conservatives stop it from moving Left under Obama? Our nation is going down the tubes and what you're doing isn't working!" Do I think that's entirely fair? No. There are a lot of conservatives who have pushed the right approach, but getting rid of people like McCain and McConnell is hard and getting them to put the country first is nearly impossible. At the end of the day though, if there are no results, people will take that Al Davis attitude and say, "Just win, baby" and they won't be all that particular about how it gets done.
- 3) We Are More Tribal Than Ever; So We Need to Have the Biggest Tribe: In the Trump era, every story is treated completely differently based on who's involved. What's shrugged off or treated as a scandal depends almost entirely on whether you're talking about Moore or Franken, Trump or Hillary. This is not a good thing for the country, but it is what it is and there's an important lesson. If everything is tribal, it's essential that conservatives hold everyone in the tribe that we have and expand our ranks. Policy should even be thought of in those terms. Does that help the people that are allied with us? Can we use this policy to bring new people into our tribe? This also means gridlock is going to be the order of the day because when everything is tribal, cooperating with the other side gets you nothing but grief from everyone involved. Again, not saying this is good, but you have to live with the world as it is, not as you would wish it to be when it regains its sanity.
- **#4)** Train Wrecks Sell: One of the biggest reasons Trump won the primary and the general election was that he absolutely dominated the nightly news on a day in, day out basis. Sometimes it was because of good things he said. Other times it was because he made news in a bad way. In any case, you could be sure that he'd always be in the news and that whatever it was for, it wouldn't be boring. This has bled down to the grassroots level. There used to be an assumption amongst conservatives that you need to be smart, interesting and have some kind of principles to make a name for

- yourself in politics. All that has now been replaced by just being "interesting." "Interesting" can mean pumping out conspiracy theories, being extremely offensive, being an outright propagandist, wildly speculating about things you can't prove or just fighting with liberals. Say something mind numbingly stupid that gets the attention of a lot of liberals and by the end of the day, you may have another few thousand twitter followers. Get enough twitter followers and you're treated as important, whether you spend your time pushing laughably bad news stories or picking fights with Leslie Jones. Does this make politics more exciting? Probably. Does it also make it dumber, more toxic and less principled? Absolutely.
- 5) The Mainstream Media Has Lost All Credibility with Much of the Population: Most politicians live by that old Mark Twain quote, "Never pick a fight with people who buy ink by the barrel." That made sense back when the mainstream media had more credibility. Today, saying that CNN, MSNBC, the WAPO or the New York Times said it means large numbers of people will assume it's a lie. Mainstream media outlets traded their "all the news that's fit to print" reputation to be partisan players. What they forgot is that nobody on the other side believes partisans, which is why Trump can go toe-to-toe with them on a daily basis and survive.
- 6) The Presidential Soapbox Matters More Than Ever: In a world where congressional gridlock has become the new norm, the presidential soapbox has become more important than ever. Realistically, Trump is not going to have a lot of legislative victories; so using the soapbox to stick it to the NFL for disrespecting the flag or helping Republicans to get rid of bad actors like Jeff Flake helps give people a sense that he's doing something important. Guess what? He is. For example, by taking on the NFL he sent a loud and clear message to corporations all across America. Every one of them is looking at the mess the NFL is in and thinking, "Thank goodness we're not in that situation. We've always been careful about offending liberals, but I guess we better make sure we don't upset conservatives either." Reagan understood the importance of the presidential soapbox, but Republicans seemed to have forgotten that lesson until Trump got into office.
- #7) The Republican Establishment is Hopeless and Must Be Replaced: If Trump's election didn't wake up the GOP establishment, then it's hard to know what could possibly do it. The very fact that the Republicans didn't even make a good faith effort to get rid of Obamacare after railing against it non-stop for years tells you it's time to give up on them. They're never going to change. What that means is that we have to get McConnell, Ryan, McCain, Flake, Corker, Graham, Alexander, Heller, Portman, Murkowski, Capito, Collins, etc. out of office if we want to save the country. These are people who will fiddle while America burns and laugh at how dumb anyone was to have ever trusted them as they stand in the ashes.

### A LESSON IN ECONOMICS, HOW THE TAX SYSTEM WORKS ??

Suppose that every day, ten men go out for beer and the bill for all ten comes to \$100...

If they paid their bill the way we pay our taxes, it would go something like this:

(You're going to love this!)

The first four men (the poorest) would pay nothing.

The fifth would pay \$1.

The sixth would pay \$3.

The seventh would pay \$7.

The eighth would pay \$12.

The ninth would pay \$18.

The tenth man (the richest) would pay \$59.

So, that's what they decided to do.

The ten men drank in the bar every day and seemed quite happy with the arrangement, until one day, the owner threw them a curve ball. "Since you are all such good customers," he said, "I'm going to reduce the cost of your daily beer by \$20". Drinks for the ten men would now cost just \$80.

The group still wanted to pay their bill the way we pay our taxes, so the first four men were unaffected. They would still drink for free.

But what about the other six men? How could they divide the \$20 windfall so that everyone would get his fair share?

They realized that \$20 divided by six is \$3.33. But if they subtracted that from everybody's share, then the fifth man and the sixth man would each end up being paid to drink his beer.

So, the bar owner suggested that it would be fair to reduce each man's bill by a higher percentage the poorer he was, to follow the principle of the tax system they had been using, and he proceeded to work out the amounts he suggested that each should now pay.

And so the fifth man, like the first four, now paid nothing (100% saving).

The sixth now paid \$2 instead of \$3 (33% saving).

The seventh now paid \$5 instead of \$7 (28% saving).

The eighth now paid \$9 instead of \$12 (25% saving).

The ninth now paid \$14 instead of \$18 (22% saving).

The tenth now paid \$49 instead of \$59 (16% saving).

Each of the six was better off than before. And the first four continued to drink for free.

But, once outside the bar, the men began to compare their savings.

"I only got a dollar out of the \$20 saving," declared the sixth man. He pointed to the tenth man, "but he got \$10!"

"Yeah, that's right," exclaimed the fifth man "I only saved a dollar too. It's unfair that he received ten times more benefit than me!"

"That's true!" shouted the seventh man. "Why should he get \$10 back, when I got only \$2? The wealthy get all the breaks!"

"Wait a minute," yelled the first four men in unison, "We didn't get anything at all. This new tax system exploits the poor!"

The nine men surrounded the tenth man and beat him up.

The next night the tenth man didn't show up for drinks, so the nine sat down and had their beers without him. But when it came time to pay the bill, they discovered something important. They didn't have enough money between all of them for even half of the bill! And that, boys and girls, journalists and government ministers, is how our tax system works. The people who already pay the highest taxes will naturally get the most benefit from a tax reduction.

Tax them too much, attack them for being wealthy, and they just may not show up anymore. In fact, they might start drinking overseas, where the atmosphere is somewhat friendlier.

### New Year, New Laws

January 1st has come and gone leaving many new laws for Californians. First among them is *legalized, recreational marijuana*. Despite U.S. Attorney General Jeff Sessions threatening to crack down on states like CA, WA, CO, and OR, our state says it will defend its right to grow, sell, and use marijuana. The state of California is also now officially a sanctuary state, meaning local and state law enforcement may not investigate, detain, or arrest people for immigration purposes. Another bill will require shopping malls, arenas, and public bathrooms to provide baby changing tables in the men's rooms, as they currently exist in women's restrooms. Our elections will be dramatically different this year as well. Counties may now issue mail-only ballots, doing away with neighborhood polling places, and instead providing ballot drop-boxes to be available four weeks before an election and "temporary voting centers" ten days prior to the election. Also, college tuition may be free for full-time freshman of California's 114 Community Colleges- if the legislature can put away enough money in the 2018-19 budgets to fund it. And finally, Californians can choose "no gender" or "nonbinary" on their birth certificates and driver's licenses (starting in 2019). If all these new bills are overwhelming for you, just wait. The second year of a legislative session is always more exciting. Get ready for what's to come! Introducing... 2018 Bills

With last session's bills becoming law January 1st behind them, the Legislature returned to the Capitol on Wednesday to begin introducing this session's bill-fest. As always with the start of legislative session, there are some very good bills introduced by our Republican representatives. Many of those bills are likely to see an early defeat, yet we fight hard to support them anyway. Here are a couple early bills that have already caught our attention:

**AB 403 (Melendez, R):** Legislative Whistleblower Protection Act- not surprisingly, this bill is finally receiving bi-partisan support. This bill, which has been killed in the Senate every prior session it has been introduced, would protect legislative staff who report improper or unethical behavior. Seems like a no-brainer, right? But since 2012, this simple bill has been stalled and killed in the Senate, which is currently dealing with multiple sexual harassment scandals. Coincidence? We think not.

**AB 1756 (Brough, R):** Repeal of the Gas Tax- Republicans are trying every avenue to repeal SB 1, the sneaky Gas Tax that came into effect November. This bill would simply repeal SB 1, the 12 cent per gallon increase on our gasoline tax, the 20 cent diesel tax increase, and the \$75-\$175 increase in vehicle registration fees.

### June Ballot Measures

There are four ballot measures on our June Primary Election ballot. Remember, only the legislature or the Governor can place measures on our June ballot. Any and all citizen driven initiatives are forced to the November ballot. Here are the June measures-we will go over them more thoroughly in subsequent Capitol Updates as well as release our official CFRW positions on each measure.


