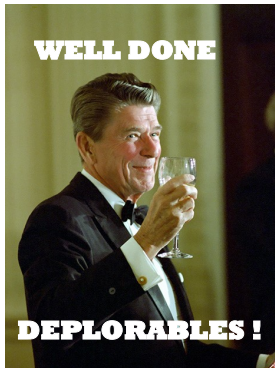

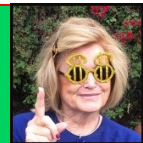

Too Close to Call

There are still two elections- one in the Assembly and one in the Senate- that are still too close to call. Unfortunately, the Democrat supermajority was already won back with Assemblyman Eric Linder (R) narrowly losing to newcomer Sabrina Cervantes (D) in Riverside County. The Assembly Democrats now control 54 seats, over 2/3rds, giving them a supermajority there for the second time in four years. And one race in the Assembly still has not been called. Assemblywoman Young Kim (R) is running behind former Assemblywoman Sharon Quick-Silva (D) in Orange County. The news from the Senate isn't much better. The Democrat supermajority comes down to one race that is still undecided- Assemblywoman Ling Ling Chang (R) barely leads newcomer Josh Newman (D) in the 29th Senate District. Assemblywoman Chang has a two-percentage point lead over Newman, so hopefully that holds, because the Senate supermajority hinges on it. While Republicans across the nation relish in their big wins, we here in California need to reevaluate our game plan. The Democrats led fundraising in the top ten state races to the tune of \$21 million to our \$8 million. While Republicans had some legislative gains two year ago, we have some work to do before next election cycle. Subject: Canada to build Wall

News Update from Canada

The flood of Trump-fearing American liberals sneaking across the border into Canada has intensified in the past week. The Republican presidential campaign is prompting an exodus among left-leaning Americans who fear they'll soon be required to hunt, pray, pay taxes, and live according to the Constitution.

Canadian border residents say it's not uncommon to see dozens of sociology professors, liberal arts majors, global-warming activists, and "green" energy proponents crossing their fields at night.

"I went out to milk the cows the other day, and there was a Hollywood producer huddled in the barn," said southern Manitoba farmer Red Greenfield, whose acreage borders North Dakota. "He was cold, exhausted and hungry, and begged me for a latte and some free-range chicken. When I said I didn't have any, he left before I even got a chance to show him my screenplay, eh?"

In an effort to stop the illegal aliens, Greenfield erected higher fences, but the liberals scaled them. He then installed loudspeakers that blared Rush Limbaugh across the fields, but they just stuck their fingers in their ears and kept coming. Officials are particularly concerned about smugglers who meet liberals just south of the border, pack them into electric cars, and drive them across the border, where they are simply left to fend for themselves after the battery dies.

After catching a half-dozen young vegans in blue-hair wig disguises, Canadian immigration authorities began stopping buses and quizzing the supposed senior citizens about Perry Como and Rosemary Clooney to prove that they were alive in the '50s.

"If they can't identify the accordion player on The Lawrence Welk Show, we become very suspicious about their age," an official said. Canadian citizens have complained that the illegal immigrants are creating an organic-broccoli shortage, are buying up all the Barbara Streisand CD's, and are overloading the internet while downloading jazzercise apps to their cell phones.

"I really feel sorry for American liberals, but the Canadian economy just can't support them," an Ottawa resident said. "After all, how many art-history majors does one country need?"

MIKE PENCE, AMERICA'S NEW VICE PRESIDENT- ELECT AND FAMILY



Mike Pence and his wife Karen have three children and reside in Columbus, Indiana. The Pence family lives in Arlington, Virginia, while Congress is in session. Mike describes himself as "a Christian, a conservative and a Republican, in that order."

Congressman Pence was elected to Congress in November 2000 and was re-elected to represent the Sixth Congressional District, encompassing much of the eastern half of Indiana, for a fifth term in 2008. In November of 2008, he was elected to serve as Chairman of the House Republican Conference. Mike Pence was born in Columbus, Indiana, graduated from Hanover College in 1981 and earned his Doctorate in Jurisprudence from Indiana University School of Law in 1986. In 1992, Pence started a career in radio broadcasting and, two years later,

Network Indiana syndicated his show statewide. The Mike Pence Show aired weekdays on 18 radio stations. Pence also hosted a Sunday morning political television show in Indianapolis from 1995 to 1999.

Mike Pence's wife is Karen Pence, whom he married in 1985. Karen worked as a school teacher for 25 years. She studied Elementary Education at Butler University, and as the first lady of Indiana, she made education one of her priorities; she frequently travels the state and visits schools. She also founded the Indiana First Lady's Charitable Foundation with the goal of supporting youths and families around the state.

Pence's oldest son is Michael Pence, who attended Purdue University in Indiana and studied to be a pilot. After graduating from Purdue, Pence decided to join the Marines, and in 2015 he became a second lieutenant.

Mike Pence's daughter is Charlotte Pence, who studied Digital Cinema and English at DePaul University, graduating in 2016. She created several documentaries during her time at the school. Charlotte has worked as a freelance producer for WFYI, a media company in Indianapolis, Indiana. During her time at WFYI, she worked on the documentary *Fleeced*, a film about elderly people being targeted by scam companies. The documentary went on to win an Emmy award that year. Pence is also an excellent writer, having published essays on websites like Thought Catalog. [One from 2014](#) discusses her feeling of being looked down upon by young people her age because she believes in God.



His youngest daughter, Audrey Pence, describes herself as socially liberal. Politically, she said she is independent and voted split-ticket during the first election in which she could participate. However, her father does not scorn her for not seeing eye-to-eye with him. Rather, Audrey says that the governor is proud that she was able to form her own beliefs. "Probably the person I get the most respect from is my dad on that and he has always...he tells me so many times, 'I am proud of you for having your own opinions and looking into things,'" Audrey said.

When does a good thing become too much of a good thing?

It's certainly a good thing that the housing market has recovered from the horrific crash that triggered the Great Recession. It's good to see new housing development underway in the San Fernando Valley, both for the construction jobs it provides and for the welcome addition to the housing inventory in a tight market.

But the development now underway in the Warner Center area of Woodland Hills and Canoga Park is concerning and raises questions about how well Los Angeles city officials have evaluated the impact on the community of building thousands of new apartments on sites that previously were commercial or industrial buildings.

Westfield just announced plans to build 1,400 apartments plus two hotels, office towers, and a 15,000-seat sports arena on the site of the Promenade mall. This week, Montage Development announced a 150-unit apartment complex with 8,000 square feet of retail on the Canoga Park site of the closed Sierra's restaurant.

Other developers plan to build 600 apartments on the Victory Boulevard site of Catalina Yachts, 300 apartments on the Topanga Canyon Boulevard site of the Broadway Shoe Warehouse, 335 apartments in place of the Woodland Hills Post Office and nearly 400 apartments on the Oxnard Street site that formerly was home to the Daily News.

Then there's United Technologies Corp.'s proposed "urban village" on the former Rocketdyne site, which the company says will include 4,000 units of housing.

What some are calling the Manhattanization of the West Valley was enabled by a planning document most Valley residents probably have never heard of: the Warner Center 2035 Plan. Passed by the City Council in 2013, it provides for increased density from about 8,000 residential units to over 26,000 in the 1.5-square-mile area from the 101 Freeway to Vanowen Street between Topanga Canyon Boulevard and DeSoto Avenue.

City officials should make a serious study of the traffic and parking impacts of all of these proposed projects together. Realistic projections, not rosy scenarios about future transit, are needed before West Valley residents are forced into permanent urban gridlock by a planning document that was never on the ballot.

A group of left-wing Californians, frustrated with the recent election of Donald J. Trump as the 45th President of the United States, has filed an application to put a secession referendum — "Calexit" — on the 2018 ballot.

The *East Bay Times* reports that the group, called Yes California, intends to circumvent the U.S. Congress: A "yes" vote would trigger a special election the following March in which residents would decide if "California should become a free, sovereign and independent country."

Another "yes" vote would require the governor of the newly minted "Republic of California" to apply to the United Nations for membership.

California has been moving in the opposite direction, politically, from the rest of the country for several years. As former Assemblyman Tim Donnelly noted earlier this week at Breitbart News, looking back on the recent election: "While blue states like Wis-

consin, Pennsylvania, and Michigan turned red for Trump, California turned a deeper shade of blue." While some expect California's left-wing policies to radiate outward to the rest of the country — especially if there is an "amnesty" for illegal immigrants — others have given up hope, given Trump's victory, and simply wish to secede, taking the nation's most populous state and the world's sixth-largest economy out of the Union.

Gov. Jerry Brown has even joked about the idea. In March, he told a union gathering: "If Trump were ever elected, we'd have to build a wall around California to defend ourselves from the rest of this country."

Proponents of secession will need 585,407 valid signatures for their referendum to qualify for the 2018 ballot. An effort to split the state into six separate states failed to qualify in 2016 for lack of signatures. *Joel B. Pollak is Senior Editor-at-Large at Breitbart News*

SACRAMENTO, Calif. — Supporters of a plan for California to secede from the union took their first formal step Monday morning, submitting a proposed ballot measure to the state attorney general's office in the hopes of a statewide vote as soon as 2018.

Marcus Ruiz Evans, the vice president and co-founder of Yes California, said his group had been planning to wait for a later election, but the presidential election of Donald Trump sped up the timeline. "We're doing it now because of all of the overwhelming attention," Evans said.

The Yes California group has been around for more than two years, Evans said. It is based around California taxpayers paying more money to the federal government than the state receives in spending, that Californians are culturally different from the rest of the country, and that national media and organizations routinely criticize Californians for being out of step with the rest of the U.S.

The attorney general's office will give the ballot measure a title and

summary, and Evans said he hopes to begin collecting signatures to get it on the ballot in the spring. Qualifying ballot measures typically requires significant resources to pay signature gatherers, and Yes California doesn't have major financial backing. But Evans said 13,000 people have volunteered to collect signatures.

"This is real," Evans said. "We treat it seriously."

Various groups have made noise about California forming its own country in the wake of Trump's election this month, most prominently Silicon Valley financier Shervin Pishevar. But similar proposals have dotted the state's political landscape for years. Yes California has tried and failed previously, and Silicon Valley venture capitalist Tim Draper was not able to get a proposal to split California into six states onto the 2016 ballot.

California Proposition Results

Unlike the good news nationally, California was a mixed bag of election results. We had some big wins and some big losses. Overwhelmingly Californians decided they wanted higher taxes and less public safety. The Assembly Republicans lost seats and the Democrats gained back a supermajority there. The

Republican Senate Caucus still has elections that are too close to call. While the nation went RED, California moved a little bit further to the left. It is clear there is still work to be done here. We can celebrate a Republican in the White House, a Republican Senate and Congress, and then get back to work here in our state. Here are the results of the propositions (via sos.ca.gov):

A General Mattis Christmas Story

He asked, "Who's the officer of the day?" The lance corporal said, "Sir, it's Brigadier General Mattis."

And General Krulak said, "No, no, no. I know who General Mattis is. I mean, who's the officer of the day today, Christmas day?"

The lance corporal, feeling a little anxious, said, "Sir, it is Brigadier General Mattis."

General Krulak said that, about that time, he spotted in the back room a cot, or a daybed. He said, "No, Lance Corporal. Who slept in that bed last night?"

The lance corporal said, "Sir, it was Brigadier General Mattis."

About that time, General Krulak said that General Mattis came in, in a duty uniform with a sword, and General Krulak said, "Jim, what are you doing here on Christmas day? Why do you have duty?" General Mattis told him that the young officer who was scheduled to have duty on Christmas day had a family, and General Mattis decided it was better for the young officer to spend Christmas Day with his family, and so he chose to have duty on Christmas Day.

General Krulak said, "That's the kind of officer that Jim Mattis is."

The story above was told by Dr. Albert C. Pierce, the Director of the Center for the Study of Professional Military Ethics at The United States Naval Academy. He was introducing General James Mattis who gave a lecture on Ethical Challenges in Contemporary Conflict. This was taken from the transcript of that lecture.

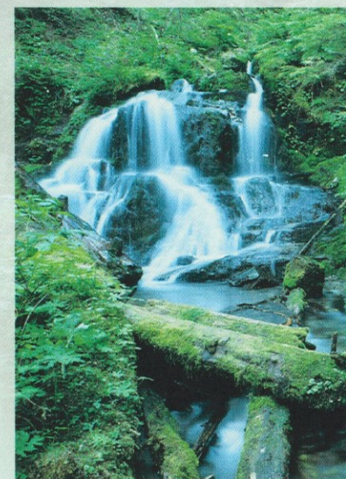

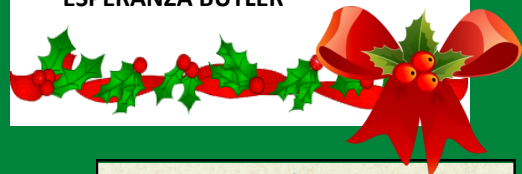
