Geraldo: Trump's Approval Ratings Are Up Because He Shows 'Leadership And Compassion'

President Donald Trump's approval ratings have continued to rise because of the president's "leadership and compassion," Fox News contributor Geraldo Rivera said Friday on "Fox and Friends."

"It's no accident that his approval rating across the board is ticking up," Rivera said. "Why is that? It's because he has shown leadership and compassion and understanding of suffering in terms of Hurricane Harvey, Hurricane Irma, and now Hurricane Maria. He has really stepped up to the plate."

"The other reason the president's popularity ticked up is this strength and reason and steadiness he is showing with the 'Rocket Man,'" he added.

By demanding harsher sanctions and calling out North Korea in his U.N. speech, Trump has drawn a clear line in the sand and put any allies of North Korea on notice, Rivera said.

"The president in confronting [Kim Jong-un] and demanding sanctions that really work," Rivera said. "For example, telling banks that do business with North Korea, however surreptitiously, that we will find you and if we find you, you will have a choice. You will do business with North Korea or you will do business with the United States of America and the civilized world. You can't have it both ways."

Trump is showing a "steady hand" and also has a capable cabinet backing him up as the administration tries to keep North Korea in check without starting a full scale war, according to Rivera.

Over 225 years after its establishment, the United States of America still leads the world as the most desirable immigration destination according to 2016 United Nations statistics. Dennis Prager: Leftism Is Not Liberalism

What is the difference between a leftist and a liberal?

Answering this question is vital to understanding the crisis facing America and the West today. Yet few seem able to do it. I offer the following as a guide.

Here's the first thing to know: The two have almost nothing in common.

On the contrary, liberalism has far more in common with conservatism than it does with leftism. The left has appropriated the word "liberal" so effectively that almost everyone — liberals, leftists and conservatives — think they are synonymous.

But they aren't. Let's look at some important examples.

Race: This is perhaps the most obvious of the many moral differences between liberalism and leftism. The essence of the liberal position on race was that the color of one's skin is insignificant. To liberals of a generation ago, only racists believed that race is intrinsically significant. However, to the left, the notion that race is insignificant is itself racist. Thus, the University of California officially regards the statement "There is only one race, the human race" as racist. For that reason, liberals were passionately committed to racial integration. Liberals should be sickened by the existence of black dormitories and separate black graduations on university campuses.

Capitalism: Liberals have always been pro capitalism, recognizing it for what it is: the only economic means of lifting great numbers out of poverty. Liberals did often view government as able to play a bigger role in lifting people out of poverty as conservatives, but they were never opposed to capitalism, and they were never for socialism. Opposition to capitalism and advocacy of socialism are leftist values.

Nationalism: Liberals deeply believed in the nation-state, whether their nation was the United States, Great Britain or France. The left has always opposed nationalism because leftism is rooted in class solidarity, not national solidarity. The left has contempt for nationalism, seeing in it intellectual and moral primitivism at best, and the road to fascism at worst. Liberals always wanted to protect American sovereignty and borders. The notion of open borders would have struck a liberal as just as objectionable as it does a conservative.

It is emblematic of our time that the left-wing writers of Superman comics had Superman announce a few years ago, "I intend to speak before the United Nations tomorrow and inform them that I am renouncing my American citizenship." When the writers of Superman were liberal, Superman was not only an American but one who fought for "Truth, justice, and the American way." But in his announcement, he explained that motto is "not enough anymore."

View of America: Liberals venerated America. Watch American films from the 1930s through the 1950s and you will be watching overtly patriotic, America-celebrating films — virtually all produced, directed and acted in by liberals. Liberals well understand that America is imperfect, but they agree with a liberal icon named Abraham Lincoln that America is "the last best hope of earth."

To the left, America is essentially a racist, sexist, violent, homophobic, xenophobic and Islamophobic country. The left around the world loathe America, and it is hard to imagine why the American left would differ in this one way from fellow leftists around the world. Leftists often take offense at having their love of America doubted. But those left-wing descriptions of America are not the only reason to assume that the left has more contempt than love for America.

The left's view of America was encapsulated in then-presidential candidate Barack Obama's statement in 2008. "We are five days away from fundamentally transforming the United States of America," he said.

Now, if you were to meet a man who said that he wanted to fundamentally transform his wife, or a woman who said that about her husband, would you assume that either loved their spouse? Of course not.

Free speech: The difference between the left and liberals regarding free speech is as dramatic as the difference regarding race. No one was more committed than American liberals to the famous statement "I disapprove of what you say, but I will defend to the death your right to say it." Liberals still are. But the left is leading the first nationwide suppression of free speech in American history — from the universities to Google to almost every other institution and place of work. It claims to only oppose hate speech. Protecting the right of person A to say what person B deems objectionable is the entire point of free speech.

Western civilization: Liberals have a deep love of Western civilization. They taught it at virtually every university and celebrated its unique moral, ethical, philosophical, artistic, musical and literary achievements. No liberal would have joined the leftist Rev. Jesse Jackson in chanting at Stanford University: "Hey, hey. Ho, ho. Western civ has got to go." The most revered liberal in American history is probably former President Franklin Delano Roosevelt, who frequently cited the need to protect not just Western civilization but Christian civilization. End the Anchor Baby Loophole With the Birthright Citizenship Act of 2017

The Birthright Citizenship Act of 2017 (H.R. 140), was introduced by Rep. Steve King (R-Iowa), has 32 cosponsors, and was designed to end the "anchor baby" loophole whereby anyone born within the United States is automatically granted U.S. citizenship, even if the parents are here illegally. According to the official summary of the bill: "This bill [H.R. 140] amends the Immigration and Nationality Act to consider a person born in the United States "subject to the jurisdiction" of the United States for citizenship at birth purposes if the person is born in the United States of parents, one of whom is: (1) a U.S. citizen or national, (2) a lawful permanent resident alien whose residence is in the United States, or (3) an alien performing active service in the U.S. Armed Forces." As you can see from this summary, a person born to two illegal immigrant parents would not qualify for automatic U.S. citizenship, if H.R. 140 becomes law. According to Rep. King: Today between 340,000 and 750,000 babies are born in America each year that get automatic citizenship even though both parents are illegal. I know of no other country in the world that does this, and it must end. The Birthright Citizenship Act of 2017 fixes it, clarifies the 14th Amendment and clarifies the Constitutional meaning of the clause, 'And subject to the jurisdiction thereof.'

William Saracino is a great source for pending California legislation. Here are more bills from Bill:

SB 219 by Scott Weiner D-Frisco, would impose a year in jail for using the wrong transgender pronoun. No really. And his last name really is Weiner, as in "what a _____". A pity his older brother Oscar Meyer isn't also in politics. At any rate, this malodorous legislation would punish people who "willfully and repeatedly "refuse" to use a transgender resident's preferred name or pronouns" in a public health, retirement or housing institution.

It includes several other provisions that require a health facility, for example, to honor the gender identity of a patient, meaning that the patient must be admitted to a room that comports with his or her chosen gender; allowed to use whatever bathroom he or she wants to use; and wear whatever clothing or cosmetics he or she decides to wear. Fines for repeat offenders could be as high as \$1,000 and a jail term of up to a year.

AB 250 by Reginald Byron Jones Sawyer would effectively prohibit most local governments from contracting out for key services. It's a union-driven bid to force the hiring of more public employees, complete with their unaffordable high benefit costs.



***And how do the Democrats manage to elect their super-majorities to the Legislature I hear you ask?** Two words - "voter fraud", you hear me answer. As Breitbart reported: "Judicial Watch, a conservative watchdog organization, has sent a letter to California Secretary of State Alex Padilla on behalf of the Election Integrity Project, noting that there are 11 counties in the state with more registered voters, and alleging that the state may be out of compliance with Section 8 of the National Voter Registration Act (NVRA).

"The letter reads in part: 'NVRA Section 8 requires states to conduct reasonable list maintenance so as to maintain an accurate record of eligible voters for use in conducting federal elections.1 As you may know, Congress enacted Section 8 of the NVRA to protect the integrity of the electoral process. Allowing the names of ineligible voters to remain on the voting rolls harms the integrity of the electoral process and undermines voter confidence in the legitimacy of elections. As the top election official in California, it is your responsibility under federal law to coordinate California's statewide effort to conduct a program that reasonably ensures the lists of eligible voters are accurate.'

Judicial Watch lays out the specifics: "[T]here were more total registered voters than there were adults over the age of 18 living in each of the following eleven (11) counties: Imperial (102%), Lassen (102%), Los Angeles (112%), Monterey (104%), San Diego (138%), San Francisco (114%), San Mateo (111%), Santa Cruz (109%), Solano (111%), Stanislaus (102%), and Yolo (110%)." The letter notes that the percentage in L.A. County may be as high as 144%.

Padilla has been one of the main voices in opposition to President Donald Trump's Presidential Advisory Commission on Election Integrity, refusing to share voter data with it on the argument that doing so would "legitimize false claims of massive election cheating last fall." Yep - having voter registration at 144% of voting age population is certainly no indication of voter fraud. Fact is - Democrats know and revel in the fact that there is massive voter fraud. 




